

Schools are still closed in NYS. Governor Cuomo will make a determination in the first week of August.



# Reopening Plans

The district is required to file a plan that covers three modes of instruction:

- In Person Instruction
- Hybrid Approach
- Distance Learning



# Plan for In Person Instruction

**LaFayette CSD is working diligently to return all pre-k to grade 12 students who are comfortable returning to school in the fall.**

- Families will receive communication from the district during the first week of August to indicate a commitment for fall instruction (in person or digital) and transportation needs.
  - Digital or In Person Instruction
  - If a hybrid option is necessary - Group A (Tues/Wed) or Group B (Thu/Fri)


The district will provide a digital/remote learning option for students who are not able or not comfortable returning

Final decision on whether the district can accommodate a full return to in-person instruction five days a week will be made pending responses from families.

# Phase In - Plan for In Person Instruction

## Training Requirements:

- Training for staff
- Symptom Checks
  - Procedures At Home and Procedures At School
- Parent Drop Off Procedures/Bus Drop Off Procedures
- Mask Wearing
- Social Distancing
- Hand Washing
- Respiratory Hygiene
- Classroom Procedures



The district is looking at a staggered start in the fall to bring in groups of students to help provide additional support. Decision will be made in August on phase in model.

# Plan for In Person Instruction

- Transportation Questions: How many families would transport their children?
  - Capacity on school vehicles
- Building Capacity Issues to Iron Out:
  - Section sizes, furniture arrangements, room utilization,
  - Increased cleaning and disinfection- recruiting additional cleaning staff
- Mitigating Risk
  - Social Distancing
  - Health Screening
    - At Home
    - AND At School
- Personal Protective Equipment
  - Masks


# Plan for In Person Instruction

In Person Learning Only Works If **Everyone** Cooperates:

- Mask Wearing
- Social Distancing
- Hand Washing/Hygiene Etiquette
- Screening for Symptoms
- Assistance with Families Transporting Children



# In Person Instruction



**Formula Determines Virus Control**

**Schools open** if region is in Phase IV & daily infection rate remains below 5% or lower using a 14-day avg. since unPAUSE was lifted.

**Schools close** if regional infection rate is greater than 9% using 7-day avg. after August 1<sup>st</sup>.





# Hybrid Learning

The district is required to submit plans for a hybrid of in-person and digital/remote learning.



# Hybrid Option A

The district is required to submit plans for a hybrid of in-person and digital/remote learning.

## Hybrid Option Plan A

- Group A will attend in-person Tuesday and Wednesday. Students not attending in-person instruction will participate in remote learning. The district is still deciding how to group students (cohorting students by household).
- Group B will attend in-person instruction on Thursday and Friday. The district is still deciding how to group students (cohorting students by household).
- Mondays would be remote learning for all students

# Hybrid Option B

## Hybrid Option Plan B:

- Grades PK-6 report for in-person learning five days a week with a digital learning option for students who are not able/not comfortable returning for in person instruction. Grades 7-12 would participate in digital/remote learning. Under this hybrid option, students without internet access or who would require special education programs or services would also be offered the opportunity to participate in in person instruction in grades 7-12.

# Hybrid Option C

## Hybrid Option Plan C:

- PK AM and the following grades (1, 3, 5, 7, 11, 12) attend in-person Tuesdays and Thursdays for the month of September. Other grade levels participate in remote learning.
- PK PM, K and even numbered grades (2, 4, 6, 8, 9, 10) attend Wednesdays and Fridays for the month of September. Other grade levels participate in remote learning.
- Mondays would be remote learning for all students and allow for deep disinfecting of the school building.

# Distance Learning

Distance Learning Plans provide instruction to students via live/recorded content.

Learning videos and materials are posted to Google Classroom.

NYSED Requires that Students Have Access to Synchronous (live instruction) and Asynchronous Instruction (recorded content)

Distance Learning is being provided as an option for students who are not able or not comfortable returning in the fall.

Distance Learning will also need to be an available option:

- Students who show symptoms of COVID, subject to isolation/quarantine
- ALL students if the school is closed by a local or state official
